Dear Professor Lederberg,

I have now heard from Cold Spring Harbor that I have been accepted for the course on Bacterial viruses which takes place from July 10th to August 5th. In view of this would it be all right if we were to arrive in Stanford shortly after August 5th? The gap between then and mid-September would otherwise be a rather awkward one for us. Also would it be possible for me to get a month's pay in advance to help cover some of our initial costs on arrival in the States?
