The practical control of syphilis in this country yes not been accomalishef atiougi in certain foreiga countries a great decresse in this disease has occurced as a resitu of mass trestrent of infectea individugls. Gonorrben is zore prevalent then spinilis and although cese for case is apt to be less severe for the jnifvidur, the rass effects approach those of syphilis in inpaining the health of the population. It is likely that resultu in the control of gonorrien by the use of present knonledge will be less striving $t=n$ in the control of spailic. it wisy be desirable, therom fore, to intensify control effonts primurily asonst syphilis. this can be done fith tie escurance that a real decline in the prevalence of tins disease ทill result.
fron a strictiy maical stanaposint the control of the vencreal discabes evntors aromat the provision of eanly and adegnete treatuent of the infocteà indivinual. Eetiods of furnizing treetrent to infected persons in urben popinations tirongh oreanized cinics heve been adequately demonstrated.

Any method of control wich is adoptod should be orgenized by and througis estobllatiod acilth asancics because of lessened eripense and tho
assumane of permencicw. Wealth deanrtacita mill continuo to edist es Jong as there are zovemacais. matisting facilities and trained person-
 tanoray periocs in onder to introduce necezsary contiol measures.

Because of difiterences in the types of public health, social and econowic oremization, stizies and tests should be uade in a number of States of various control hessures designed to suit locel condethons. As er enthole of such demongtrations may be cited the projects in Scott and Imica Com m es, conforcree Keormendatiens.

In vien of the inticaitel extensive previlence of venemel diseases among necrose, tive finisquacy of meficsi sovice'for nespoes in practienily all murai areas, the lame number of infected persons wo fatl to continue trestagat uritil cured, and the serious consomences of the veneres itsenese to inaivicual health and eficiency, it is rectmond ed:

1. Thet the Juifis novenala runl cooperato rith the Pưlic Health Service, State and loct ceparisents of acolth in the control of the veneresl disesses.
2. Thet this cocpevevion be directez prinarily during the first year
 menods of Epplring eristing inonleige to this prosicn. these studieg and tests should be fcllcued Ey such biact ageljection of control measures aver a period of yeare as may be docyez ecvicable.
3. That preforence be given to control activities in rural districts vitu a lemge recto populction.
4. Hat at the outset tie motor effort be directed against syphilis becsuss in this chsease opportunity is offered to accomplish nore promot resulits.
5. Thet the aothols to be follored in any Stete be agreed upon with the state keith ationities and the rublis reelth service; and that tie major intemest be the development of more effertive medicnl service to infected individuais as a asans of preventing the spread of these diseases and of protioting their cure.
6. that medical service tace the form of (a) trafning of private
 (b) more exiensive dibtribution of entisyinilitic dmuss and the promotion of nider use of state diagnostic laboratory facilitios; (c) utilization of negro clinioians and nurees to suppleaent exating peroonnel in county health departuents; (d) cooperaition with inanstriel corcorations in providing more effective treatment serfice for empiogees; (e) extension of acisting clinical service on the establightant of aditional clinical service; and (f) other nethots which mev be devoloped.
 regarding cooperation which shall mete clocr thet the fund is not to assure responeibility for the control of the venereal aiseases in the general popu-
lation cr any sout therof; that tio control of tiese diseases is the function of official hoalth sjencles; and that the activities of the fund in this particular acid mill be linited to derelowing and popularizing effec-

7. Thst no control gessures be instituted in any comanity until at least 50 ge proportim of the expanse thereof is bome locally that the leagit of time durins mich assistance vill be given by the fund on a giten project be anouncea, sujject to mocirincation as the necessity may arise; and that the expadisures of the Fund in a given commity be decreased in accordance mith a predetarnined scale.

The appropriations of tha Zublic Heath Service for venereal disease control activities are very limited. \#̈orever, it will be expected thet an experzenced officer rill be ascigned to full tims duty in connecticn with the proposed dewonstrstions, should they materialize. Also, an officer of the Service nom on duty in Tennessee in connection fith the developanit of the venervel disease control progrsin in that State mill devote procticelly all of his the to these proposed stuaies and demonstrations. In ectaition, the thiof of the Divisicn of Venereal Diseases mill devote a part of his time to this mort:

cost of operating this clinic is appocimately $16,000.00$ per annum. If full advantaze is teker of the monerful opportmity for instruction in prectionl vencreal disence work offered by this clinic, increased topenditures will be neeesery to provice for some additional fecilities.

It is esticated tnat, in eidition to the equenditures already authorized by the Julius Rocenmald Fund for venereal disease control nork in biscissippt end rennessee, a sum not to exceed $050,0 c 0.00$ will be required to cemy out the studies and demonstretions recomended in this report turing the year ending December 3i, 1950.

In explenaticn it may je stated that it sems desirable to supplemort these stucies in remessee and to inaugurate cadiztioncl stuates end teste in Coorgia, Loutisana, North Carolina and wexas, contingent on active narizicipetion in these proiecta by the state and locsl health authorities. whe approptinticns mitici have already been rade by the rund for sinfler ctuaies in :Hsciesippl should be sufficient.
