Hello to everyone in the group and thank you again for the stipend for September.

How are the projects on P-13 → P-20 and on the cleavage of C and F by Hpa and R<sub>II</sub> progressing? Naturally I am interested to know about any exciting results.

I have made some progress with preparation of viral stocks and SV40 DNA. The fragments are being transcribed and fingerprinted fairly well, with the best results so far on H, J, and I. The samples of C and of E (either native or denatured) are not so efficiently transcribed; hopefully, enough transcript to work with will be made after preparation of more DNA fragments. We would find the Hpa enzyme useful for C of course. Has the new member of your group had any luck with the Hae and/or R<sub>II</sub> enzymes?

For the "Wilson S. Stone Memorial Award" which you pointed out to me before I left, I need a letter of recommendation from you that should contain "a brief evaluation of the significance of the results and a paragraph about the time, place, and nature of the candidate's training."
