In exceptional circumstances, an effect like the peculiar malformations induced by thalidomide comes to the surface, and then achieves a visibility and notoriety all out of proportion to other agents. If the malformation induced by thalidomide were a mental retardation of ten percent of the I.Q. instead of a highly characteristic and unusual deformation of the limbs, in an equal number of subjects, we would be unaware of it to this day.
