## K-12 history

To the best of my recollection, I got "K-12" from Ed Tatum when I came to Yale in March 1946, and kept my own stocks of it. I have no record of re-clonings; but from a very early time I followed the possibility of minimizing reboiling of a stock culture. If and identifable variant (cloning technology, etc.) were noticed it would be given a distinctive stock number.

I have no recollection that K-12 was ever lost or contaminated so as to call for a recall or replacement. But without an exhaustive search through my correspondence (a 10 year task) I can't be sure. You might do well to ask Larry Moore (Denver) if he remembers anything in that line.

Do also keep in mind the first step mutants from K12:

58, 679

(Δ is auxotroph)

W1244  $\Delta z^R$

W1485, 1872  $\lambda$ -sensitive

that are fairly ancient.

Frits + Ida Oostkoo dropped by the other day. I asked them about Levin's "restations" of K-12. He pointed out they were merely "symmetrized" and have not been sew-typed.
