

Wsh:

There have been economic, black fly & parasite infestation measurements to assess the project to date. They indicate little resettlement of the lands in the heavily infested areas because of other factors & black fly (infected) pop^u is effectively reduced by spraying but new infestation from areas beyond the control region introduce reinfestation over distances previously thought impossible. It seems to be a "disease suppression" program - not eradication. It is expensive and only affects one of many health problems in the countries. There is no end in sight!
