

Thank you for the copy of the article from the <u>Times</u> on hydrazine toxicity. I find it fascinating that, in addition to hydrazines being present as industrial chemicals, fungi including the common edible mushroom have phenylhydrazines present in amide linkage as a natural product. The fungi also apparently contain the enzyme to hydrolize this amide bond (Archives Biochem and Biophysics, 1979, 192:235-240; J Amer Chem Soc 1961, 83:503-504).
