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
Dear Bud:

As important as they may be, I do not have in mind epidemiological surveys or clinical trials to evaluate already quasi-established therapies. Of course what I have in mind is to build a stronger conceptual foundation for the policies to govern the future of the Hospital/Clinical Research Center here.

If you need any more information about that it will be readily forthcoming. I also look forward to an opportunity to discuss these matters with you further again when, as I hope, we may see each other closer to hand.
