Dear Mr. Morowitz:

I have your letter of the 30th concerning openings here for a postdoctoral fellowship. As you say, it is very late in the year for such arrangements, and I regret the necessity of informing you that our limited facilities have already been fully committed. A vacancy might conceivably develop by default, but there would be no information on this till this summer.

The Public Health Service post-doctoral fellowships for this year, as you probably know, can still be applied for, but most of the deadlines for other sources have been passed.

May I suggest that you write to Dr. A. Novick, Institute of Radiobiology and Biophysics, University of Chicago, concerning the possibility of working on your fellowship there? They have just occupied a large new building and should be in a very favorable position with respect to space. In addition, the interests of his group coincide reasonably closely with your own, and in my own opinion, the quality of their work is excellent. The possibility of a later association here would not be preempted.

I should be interested to receive reprints of your pending publications. Please give my best to Dr. Pollard and Dr. Burkholder.
