Thank you for your last group of strains; it no langer matters much how many come in a given package. One or two of them were conteminated with Protous, and it was only by plating an synthetic medium that I was able to separate the cell, as den't finish think this an accusation. Two or three of the cultures in this group appear to be crossing with K-12. I hope it will not put you cut to centime to send similar natorial. However, cultures actually isolated from an plates are not likely to be usuful, whereas must of those from an plates are not likely to be usuful, whereas must of those from an treated animals remain 8°, at least for my purposes.

Four # 41 - 46 appear to be identical, judging from appearance an EED sucross and on their collected activity. D and D are easily distinguished. 61-62 housest are probably identical.

As I wrote to Dr. Hiller, there may ar may not be any point in attempting these comparative identifications. I would be happy to seeperate with you on this, but if the issue is really warthelile, it should be continued on a scale incommonwate with the incomvenience of transchipping the cultures and secretaring the isolations and the diagrams at this distance.
