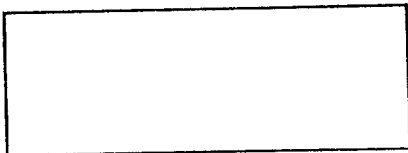
recollections of Ed Tatum
