Prompted by concern over the recent cuts in federal funding for cancer research and other key areas of scientific research, students and faculty members at a number of colleges in the New York metropolitan area have recently banded together to form the National Collegiate Association for the Conquest of Cancer (NCACC). The primary aim of this organization is to spur the government to make cancer research a major area of national priority and to undertake a program of intensive research aimed at the conquest of cancer. The program envisioned would be a broad-based attack, firmly founded in basic biomedical research.

Further details of the aims and activities of this organization are outlined in the enclosed recruitment letter and other sample materials, which have been sent out to major colleges and universities throughout the country.

In fostering and guiding the activities of the organization, it would be helpful to have an advisory board of eminent scientists. We sincerely hope that you will lend us your support.
