Dear Professor Lederberg:

Some time ago you wrote asking for two items, the report of our conference on property law and comments on the uses of land speculation. Enclosed is the report I filed with Russell Sage on the conference.

Concerning your column, you are probably aware of the difficulties in appraisal the Labor Government encountered in Britain when they attempted after World War II to assess a betterment tax against land appreciation engendered by the granting of favorable planning permits. Also, presumably, if you taxed the landowner on appreciation when the freeway is installed, you will compensate him for loss when the freeway is re-routed, replaced by rapid transit, or the value of adjoining sites is reduced because the freeway becomes impassible for overuse.

If you are ever in Los Angeles and would like to talk about some of these questions, let's get together.
