Thile I am pleased at your efforts to focus public attention on some problems of vitak importance, I find that I differ sufficiently on some details (or perhaps mainly emphases) that I cannot identify myself as an "endorser". My public position is sufficiently exposed that I have to attend to such details in a way that may seem excessively fussy to nayone who has not shared that experience.

However, since I often write on population questions in my newspaper column, I do think your efforts at educating me may be whll-spent, at least to keep me from grievous error. If you want to reprint fair quotations from my more relevant places, I would be pleased at the critical feedback this might elicit.

Finally, two favors: 1) any chance of the back issues of the ZPG reporter for my own files; and 2) what about a full set and subscription for the reading room of our Human Biology program at Stanford (on which Paul Ehrlich is a co-director)?
