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I hope oversimplification isn't betrayal.

Lots of questions keep crowding my thoughts on this-- surely yours, a *fortiori.

How certain is it that the segregating antigen is infectious? Obviously, it would be rather suspicious to see a recessive antigen; but is it excluded that you have just this (like some Lewislike phenomenon), and a fortuitous cross-reaction with (perhaps even tolerance to) a knepatis virus?

Do you have any views on the origin of the "class"-stratification of HAA, e.g., among paid donors? (Cf. my speculative extrapolation of your anthropological-genetic picture to the U.S. situation.)

Anyhow, all this is put down in a spirit of unmitogated admiration; which flattery, I hope, will not deter you from correcting any errors of fact that may be contaminating my own thinking about these problems.
