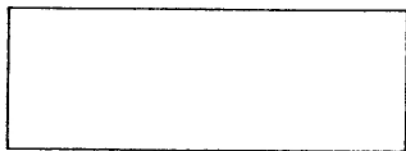

and I wonder if you have any material that might illuminate that.

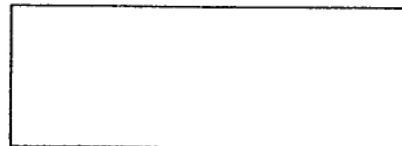
For this possibly considerable favor I would be most appreciative.
