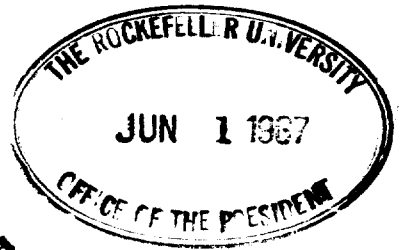

Dear Josh:

The draft for "Perspectives" seems fine to me. It brings back many pleasant memories. I don't think the length is a problem. I'll get together with Bill Dove and see if we have any useful suggestions. I think that Young is a better source than I for Drosophila cytogenetics. The old explanation that most breaks are intergenic still seems to me to be the best explanation for the lack of phenotypic effects of so many euchromatic inversions.

I sent your reprints a couple of days ago. Fortunately, I had more than one copy of each of them, so I'll still have copies for myself. There is no need to return the ones I sent (if this was what you had in mind).

Enclosed is a quick modification of Paul Marks' draft. I think my first sentence is true, but it perhaps should be toned down. The list of contributions is representative. One correction, though: The third reference should include Muller and me as coauthors.
