If you have taken the tests yourself, you will have noticed how ambiguous (perhaps purposely so?) are many of the questions. I had particular trouble with parts V and VI of "Personal Audit". In V, I could not tell whether a reaction was asked for potential situations, taking into account their improbability and remoteness from personal experience, or whether one should assume their reality— how would you react if you were trapped in a burning building? or is this possibility something that concerns you? In VI, I could not define "dislike".
