Dear Gots:

Thenks for your word on the Lysogenicity of B. coli B. I shall be interested and squeed to hear how this turns out.

We don't pick up very many purineless mutants, and most of our recent mutant hunts have been in Salmonella. which I suppose you will not care too much for. I am sure that you can get w-1926 (the disminopurine-responding strain) from Guthrie: I don't happen to have it in open stock, and would prefer to conserve the lyophil tubes for the present, if this is not inconvenient for you. W-1926 is from a different line of E. coli/ than K-12.

I am trying to round up a few mutants we do have in K-12 to send to Seymour Cohen in a couple of weeks. It would be a convenience to me if you could pick up copies of them directly from him.
