Dear Professor Lederberg,

Thank you for your letter of November 26th. Since then I have written again to Dr. Hughes, of John and E. Sturge Ltd., Selby, Yorkshire, who requested your K12 strain of E. coli. He has now replied:-

"The idea from which I hope to develop a method of gluconic acid determination was described by S.S. Cohen, J. Biol. Chem. 177, 607, (1949), "Adaptive enzyme formation in the study of uronic acid by the K12 strain of E. coli". The author observes that 'the most marked diauxie was observed with the K12 strain of Tatum and Lederberg, (J. Bact, 53, 673, 1947)'.
