Dear Mr. Hartmann:

I regret we do not have any mutants of K-12 of the character mentioned in your letter of the lith. Like yourself, we would like to have one. On the other hand, we have frequently isolated lytic variants of lambda which may suit your own purposes. These variants are readily detected as clear plaques in platings of excess lambda with sensitive bacteria.

The question whether the up iccus controls the maintenance of lambda, or is the actual site of the provinus in the lysogenic bacterium is one of the greatest interest. By and largest the evidence seems to favor the latter.

From what can be seen at the moment, the system lambde-2 (the lytic variant) + K-12 (or W-1485) would seem to be as appropriate for cytological comparisons with innuction as would lambde + K-12 "alymophoretic mutant". In either case, you would be desired with a somewhat distinct thain of host-virus interactions.
