Dear Dr. Edwards:

We have recently worked with a group of *Salmonella typhimurium* strains, received from Lilleengen, among which there are some which are almost certainly showing genetic recombination like that of *E. coli* K-12. We are preparing to do some serological work with these cultures. I am writing to ask your help in providing certain cultures needed to prepare the sera we are interested in. The cultures are as follows:
