Was the trouble with the sintered gladd filters the main reason for switching to an electro-mechanical chemostat regulator? Or was it the desibability of absolute pre-calibration, or something else?

If it was the filter, do you think this type of fixed hydrodynamic resistance would work any better:

a pair of conventric glass tubes, the inner tube sealed. The space between the tubes constitutes the resistance. If necessary, the tubes could be ground to the necessary near fit, and the components spot—"welded" for rigidity. in A relatively non-clogging high, fixed resistance ought to be manageable this way.

Or shouldn't I waste myytime going over cld ground?
