Dear Josh,

Please forgive the typing.

I liked your idea for a fixed bacterial suspension. We had about 1/2 liter (per went day) because it would slowly clog, gradually decrease the flow rate - despite very careful clarification with an even finer filter. Capillaries we rejected for fear some catalyst say of NH_4PO_4 might clog the whole hole. But your design should be free of this trouble. We may try it.

When Delbrück was here he said that Vogt had been studying the microcolonies on a recombination plate. Apparently, a very small fraction contain very "odd" bacterial forms! The suspicion, of course, is that these are "gamete producers" or the like. This is all I know about it.

I got a letter from Tatum about a round-table for SAB meeting in Boston. Never having been in Boston and having some good friends there, I accepted. I hope you guys are coming. I think Jane will also come.

By the way, we are going to have a baby in August. Just got confirmation on Thursday. You guys are next.

We have been having many headaches in the lab. No clear picture of regulation of amino acid synthesis has appeared. I thought it was all wrapped up 2 days ago.

Incidentally I told you how our B/t makes a tryptophane like substance in high concentration. We have tried some ten other independent B/t isolations and none of them give this stuff out. I'd like to try the "isolated B/t". To save me opening a new tryptophane tube could you mail me a slant from the tube I sent

you. Simply deep freezing the whole plant seems to work fine. We get large recoveries after many months in the deep freeze. I ~~should~~ recommend this scheme to you.

Your tile about 679 reminded me that it (at 680,...) also showed ~~the~~ ^{some} difference in reactivities from K-12 and the others. Does this mean that Tetam picked a triple mutant?
