Dear Josh,

I have been wondering whether you have given very serious consideration * to the development of laser telemetry systems. According to John (Atwood), a gas laser with a 1 meter transmitting telescope would have a beam diameter of about 50 miles at a distance of 10^8 miles. This is ca. 10^{13} times better than 4π transmitters could do. In his opinion, such instruments, including sufficient pointing devices, could be developed within two years.

The telemetry problem as it stands now is a real inhibitor of thought on the Mars program, and a drastic improvement in telemetry might be more worthwhile than all the attempts to make experiments feasible with present means.

I hope we will have a chance to talk things over in October.
