Dear Helen,

Thank you for your letter of December 23.

What I had told Professor Lederberg when I talked to him in Pavia was as follows to the best of my recollection.

1) That some time ago we had got together a number of popular articles and had given them to a publisher (Manisha Granthalaya). That before the articles were published I had wished them all to be dated, i.e. the date of their original publication ascertained in order to print alongside the article, and I had asked the publishers to do this but I had not heard from them again.

2) That most articles that were published in India or since Haldane went to India would be available in typescript form with Hari and it would be a job to find out the dates of all articles and where they were published.

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Professor Lederberg had offered copying facilities in the U.S.A. and also perhaps obtaining money from a publisher to finance any research that would be necessary in order to get articles ready to be reprinted. This money would of course be in the nature of an advance.

I wonder whether you received my letter written after my conversation with Professor Lederberg. I am still waiting for your comments and suggestions in this regard.
