Many thanks for your letter and invitation. Under different circumstances, I'd love to participate; not only have I followed the AIDS story closely - for pedagogical purposes, as an advisor to Chiron, and as a retrovirologist - but I've been involved politically as chairman of a committee to find a suitable name for the AIDS virus. So I have had more than one interaction with the press already.

However, there are two main problems: I will be in the midst of lecturing in our virology course, and I am committed to a trip East nine days later. And, of course, there is the matter of money. So I think I had better say no.

I do have one suggestion: Colin Norman of <u>Science</u> whose account of the virus-related politics was exemplary.
