

GENERAL ORDERS, }

WAR DEPARTMENT,
ADJUTANT GENERAL'S OFFICE,
Washington, June 20, 1861.

I...The organization of the Field and Staff of all Regiments mustered into the service of the United States, for a longer period than three months, must conform strictly to the requirements of General Orders, No. 15, from this Office, dated May 4, 1861, and payments will be made only when in accordance with it.

II...The several Medical Directors of the Army will, when they have reason to doubt the professional competency of any of the medical officers under their charge, organize a Board of not less than three Medical Officers, which shall examine said officers of questioned professional capacity, and decide whether they are competent to the performance of their duties. If the decision of the Board is adverse, they will cease to be in the military service of the United States.

III...Major Albert J. Smith, Paymaster, U. S. Army, having deserted his Post—Key West, Florida—his name will be stricken from the rolls of the Army.
