


Aseptic Antitoxine Syringe

As shown in the illustration, this syringe is of large size and enclosed in a handsome metallic case, $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch thick, $2\frac{1}{4}$ inches wide and 6 inches long, and provided with round corners and edges. The clamps holding the syringe and attachments in place are of metal, thus rendering the entire apparatus aseptic. The needles are steel of extra quality, and reinforced. They are attached to the syringe by a short piece of rubber tubing, so that when introduced sub-cutaneously the accidental moving or swaying of the syringe barrel will not affect the position of the needle in the tissues.

The stage is of ample size and circular. If desired, a rotating glass stage can be substituted for the plain stage.

GEAR'S UNIVERSAL MICROSCOPE.

THE motive which prompted the introduction of this Microscope was to be able to furnish an outfit that would fully meet the requirements of the Practicing Physician or Student in the line of scientific research at a low cost.


To show that we have succeeded in this, a glance at the instrument will suffice.



The Edebohl's Leg Supports may be lifted and removed from their sockets when not in use. Adjustable Foot Stirrups may be substituted in place of the Leg Supports, or both may be furnished as desired. An inclined extension piece accompanies the Table to lengthen it, and serve as a support for the head.




Fig. 2—Sims' Elevation.

Fig. 2 represents Sim's Position, which is obtained by turning the screw handles shown just within the closet door. By this means the top of Table may be raised to any elevation desired. The set screws on either side furnish additional support when required.

An extension piece, mentioned above, is placed on the right side for the purpose of giving support to the knees, and may be removed when not in use. The broad sliding shelf is useful for placing instruments, basins, towels, etc.

Fig. 1 illustrates the general appearance of Table. It is made of finely-finished, well-seasoned oak, with all parts nickel plated except those on drawers and closet, which are of polished brass. The top of Table is four feet and six inches in length and twenty-four inches in width; height of Table, thirty-two inches. There are three large and commodious drawers, and one large closet opening from either side, thus allowing the physician easy access to them, on whichever side he may be placed. The Table is mounted upon castors, and may be readily moved

The broad sliding shelf is useful for placing instruments, basins, towels, etc.



The back supporting position will commend itself for various operations necessary to be performed in an upright or sitting posture.




Fig. 5—Back Support.


Shoulder Brace with Steel Spinal Brace.

Designed for the more confirmed cases of rounded shoulders, accompanied with considerable weakness of the muscles.

In this Brace there are two steel springs, arranged longitudinally upon either side of the spine, as shown by the dotted lines of the cut. A wide, abdominal belt is attached near the lower extremity of these springs, and affords support to the abdominal muscles as determined by the tension imparted to the lacings.

In ordering, state sex, circumference of chest under axillæ, circumference of pelvis, crest of ilium to axillæ, length from a line crossing the spine, one inch below the top of the scapula to another upon a level with the iliac crests.

Double-Bar Ankle Brace for the Support of Weak Ankles.



These instruments are used to maintain the position of the foot, after the relief of valgus or varus by the regular club-foot shoe, and also for correcting simple lateral inversion or eversion of the ankle-joint, resembling varus or valgus, commonly called weak-ankle.

This consists of two bars or stems securely fastened to the sole of a laced shoe, extending to the garter on each side of the limb, with joints at the ankles. The ankle is protected by small round soft pads, to prevent chafing against the steel, and is supported and kept in its corrected posture by a triangular, V-shaped leather strap, acting against and buttoned to the steel bar on the opposite side. This brace, having double bars, gives perfect security, and keeps the sole in a strictly horizontal plane.

DIRECTIONS FOR ORDERING.

1. Send a well fitting shoe or shoes to lace.
2. State whether the ankle turns in or out.
3. Mention whether for right or left foot or both feet.
4. Length from sole of foot to garter, below the knee.

APPARATUS FOR BOW-LEGS.



The mechanical treatment of bow-legs is very simple. 1. The bones in a softened condition, yielding under the weight of the body, must be assisted by extraneous help. 2. The arched bones must be restored to their normal condition. The instrument illustrated by the cut answers the purpose admirably.

The support is giving by double stems of steel (secured to a shoe) carried up as high as the thigh—jointed at the ankle and knee to allow the patient perfect freedom of motion. They are kept in place by calf and thigh-bands.

The bow is corrected by pads being placed respectively against the ankle and knee on the concave side of the limb, whilst a strap passed around on the highest point of the arc, inside of the outer stem, tightly buttoned to the steel bar on the concave side, gradually compels the leg to become parallel with it.

DIRECTIONS FOR ORDERING.

State which leg, right or left. Distance from bottom of foot to knee joint. Distance from bottom of foot to highest point of arch.

Distance from knee to middle of thigh. Circumference at ankle.



Apparatus for the Support of Weak Legs.

THIS APPARATUS is for the support of weak legs, when by reason of relaxed joints, softening of the osseous structure, or partial paralysis, they cannot quite bear the weight of the body; but where the muscles still retain some power to perform their respective functions. Very light steel springs are secured to shoes, and carried up the sides of the legs and to the pelvis. They are provided with joints corresponding to the natural ones, and secured to calf, thigh and pelvis by well-padded bands and buckles. The following measures are required:

Apparatus for Knock-Knee.

FOR the treatment of Knock-knee, this apparatus is the most effectual one of which we know. It consists of two lateral stems, with ankle, knee and hip joints, extending from the heels of strong shoes, to a pelvic band, which encircles the body. Two padded straps are buttoned on each side of the steel stems, one above and one below the knee joints, crossing each other behind. We also make, instead of the two straps, leather caps, placed on the inside of the knee joints and buttoned to the steel stems on the outside, and padded bands above the ankle, and around the thigh, C, aid in directing the force outward.

APPARATUS FOR CLUB FEET.



The illustration represents a modification of Scarpa's Shoe, affording a continuous support in the earlier stages of a tendency of the foot to turn, while suitable confining and elastic force tends to overcome the contracted aspect of the limb, and to ensure a continuance of the normal form after the deformity has been reduced by the surgeon. Extreme cases of inversions and eversions have to be met, of course, with suitable variations of the instrument in each case, whether of talipes varus, talipes equinus, talipes vulgus, talipes calcaneus, etc. State--

Dr. L. A. Sayre's Long Splints for Hip Disease.


This Splint differs from the short one before described in the following particulars:—In the first place, it extends the entire length of the limb, receives the weight of the body upon a cross bar under the foot and a steel girdle encircling the pelvis, having two perineal straps. The long hollow steel tube reaching from the pelvis to the sole of the foot, has a solid steel rod running inside of it, furnished with a ratchet, movable up and down for lengthening or shortening, by a key which works in the ratchet through an opening on the outer side of the tube. The contrivance for locking is the same as that described on the short splint. The upper part of the long hollow steel tube is solid and strong, fastened to the steel girdle by a simple bolt making a flat joint, permitting fore and backward movements of the hip joint only, or a ball and socket joint.

The steel girdle is well padded on its inner surface, and terminates in two buckles, in which are buckled a partly padded strap of webbing for closing the belt. From two points in front to two points in the back perineal straps for counter extension pass along the perineum and under the ischii. A stout leather sole is fastened to the cross-bar at the bottom of the instrument, and a strong leather strap passes through apertures just above the cross-bar, turns up an end on each side of the ankle and fastens into the buckles attached to the tabs from the adhesive plaster of the leg. This completes the attachments at the lower portion of the instrument, for making extension. There is also attached to the bar running along the outer side of the limb a cross-piece which can be adjusted to a position conforming to that of the knee joint, unto this is buckled a buckskin knee-cap for the steady support of the knee.

THIS INSTRUMENT consists of a pelvic band passing partly around the body under the crest of the ilium, well padded on its inner surface, to which usually two perineal straps are fastened for counter extension; the outer surface of the pelvic band holds a ball and socket joint terminating into a tubular steel rod, divided into two sections, one sliding, with ratchet movement, into the other. The lower end of the inside rod is connected with two semi-circular bands, fitting the thigh just above the knee. Extension is obtained by using the key which operates the ratchet.



IT consists of a curved steel rod, having an eye in its centre and hooks at each end. From the end hooks loops pass down under each axilla, and also to the chin and occiput, to support the head. The length of these loops can be graduated to suit every patient by separate straps and buckles that connect the loops with the iron rod. Those parts of the loops that pass under the axilla and chin are well padded.

The whole apparatus is attached by the eye in the center of the iron rod to one of a set of compound pulleys, and the opposite pulley being secured to the ceiling or some other safe attachment of sufficient height; the patient is easily elevated by the bands under the axilla, chin and occiput, until the heels cannot touch the floor.
