Dear Sir.

You will see from the enclosed letter the main objects with which this Association was formed last year. At present the organization consists of President, Vice Presidents & General Committee chosen as far as far from the point of view of gathering in the whole county & as much money as possible. The working Executive committee consists of people who have been instrumental in starting the association:

The main point of the organization in the County I think, the formation of small local committees to take over the ~~area~~ management of districts within the county such districts covering wherever practicable of the existing local districts, for example in this

county; the Ellermead rural district, Ludlow rural D.

Wellington. Rural. etc. In case since it is considered  
that such districts are too large they have been  
divided: The duties of such local committees have been  
made to be -

- ① to collect subscriptions (especially the small ones)
- ② to assist in the selection of cases for the sanatorium  
treatment -
- ③ to assist in the after-care of such cases
- ④ to assist in the help in their own homes of those  
unfit for sanatorium treatment -
- ⑤ generally to carry out the objects of the association.

Great stress has been laid upon the necessity of working  
through those who know & are known by the  
people as being the most likely way of getting hold  
of the patients early. And for the same reason, stress  
has been laid upon the sanatorium being built in

the County and for the County only. The difficulty of persuading early cases to go off to a distant Sanatorium about which they know nothing is one. This is my great & much we hope to get over this way = by encouraging the my poor to give something to even 1<sup>o</sup> or 2<sup>o</sup>. towards their own Sanatorium. There are no actual rules & regulations made at present as regard admittance & maintenance but I trust I can put out the feelings of the Committee on several points.

- ① There will be no letters of recommendation: such system causing delay in admittance & trouble in choosing the correct cases.
- ② all patients will be made expected to pay what they or their friends can afford towards their maintenance. At full sum estimated at 20/- & 25/- per week.

this gives us the chance of helping the class of poor clerks  
& higher up people who at present are badly off.

- No difference will be made in the treatment or a punishment

③ The cases for admittance to the lunatum will leave &  
appear before a central medical board. Such will  
meet at convenient dates. (once a week or fortnight).  
& will have to be sent from local committees in such  
the local medical men will serve.

In the County especially it is very difficult for local  
medical men to decide upon the claims for admission  
especially from the point of view of offending their own  
private patients who wish to get dependants admitted  
we hope by means of this central medical board to get over this.

④ The question of reserving beds for certain districts or private  
members has been raised but I think will fall through  
sooner & the obvious disadvantages. People working & endow  
a bed, will only have the privilege of giving it their name.

③ medical staff: we shall have a regular medical man. with a salary of £200 - £250. and the central medical board; some one or more of whom will be visiting medical officers or committee. on this point I should be very glad of your opinion as to the best plan. It is difficult to avoid either multiplying the medical men at the mandates & getting no. suited scheme of treatment. or giving offence to prominent medical men in the County. My own general idea would be 1. consulting or visiting man. & then the medical board behind him.

I am afraid that this is not a very clear description of our organization. the points with the committee

consider the most important are the position of a  
County association & the local committees all  
working under the central committee but with as free  
a hand as possible. All payments are made from  
the central committee & all subscriptions paid to the  
central fund: - a good deal of discretion will be left to  
the local secretaries to disburse funds. -

The work in the people's own homes will consist of erecting  
shelters, where possible, suggesting alterations in living rooms,  
obtaining more suitable work, etc. Under the usual attempts  
at educating them in modes of cleanliness &c.
