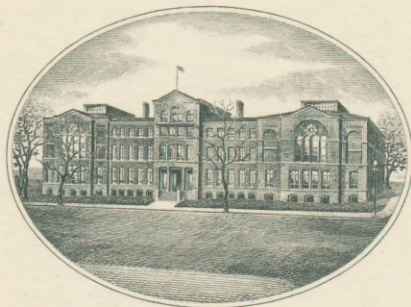

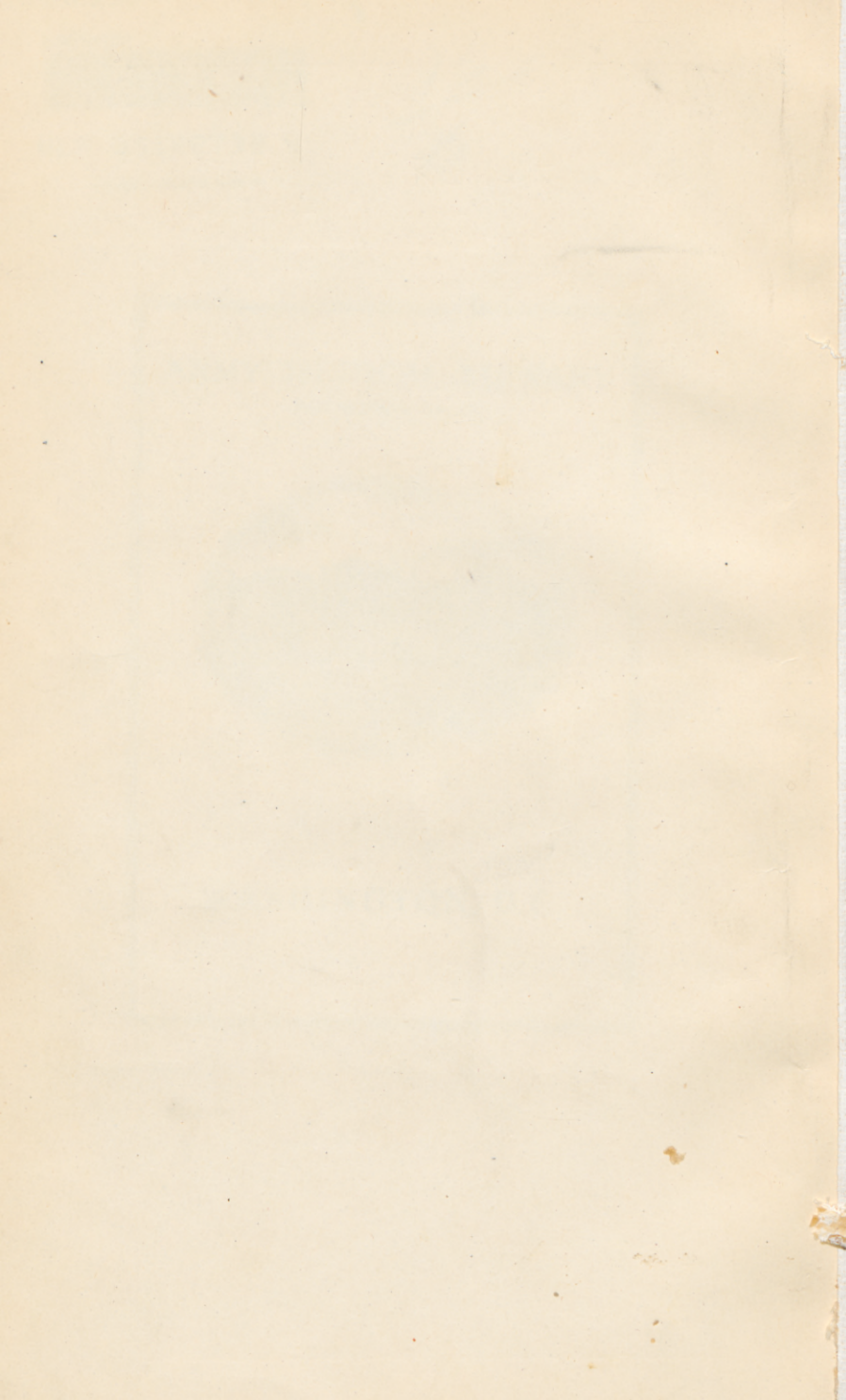

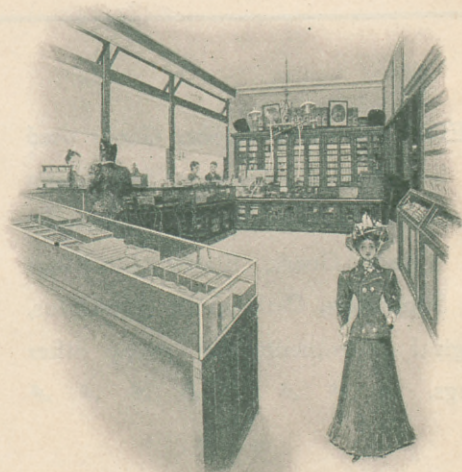

## A FRIENDLY BOTTLE.

The best "Friendly Bottle" is a Hot-Water Bottle. It is the friend in need, and should be found in every household.

A Hot-Water Bottle is insurance against emergencies. It should be of the right sort—the kind that neither breaks, leaks nor hardens; the kind that can be depended upon when the occasion arises.

The best bags give the greatest satisfaction, and are cheaper in the end. An inferior Hot-Water Bottle is both unsatisfactory and dangerous. The breaking of a poor bag may seriously scald a patient.

All kinds, makes and sizes of Hot-Water Bottles can be had at Riker's Drug Store. Very little ones for face or throat, others for head, spine or other special purposes, larger sizes for general use.

They are made of plain rubber, or covered with cloth or flannel.

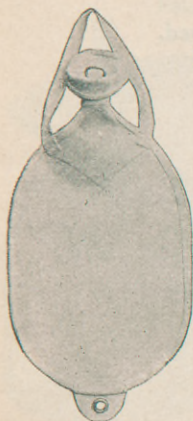

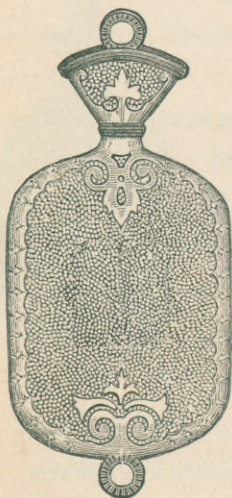
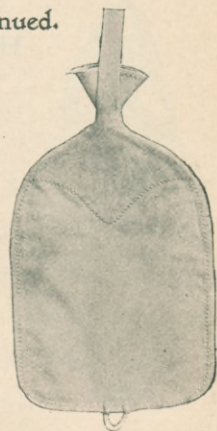

**To Fill a Hot-Water Bottle.**—First put in a cupful of cold water and then add hot water until one-half filled. Don't more than one-half fill a hot-water bottle.

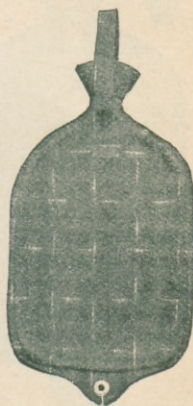

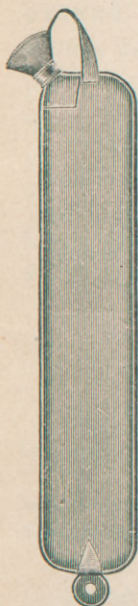

After filling a hot-water bottle, always be sure it is tightly stoppered. Turn it upside down and press between the hands, to see that the water does not leak out. This simple precaution may save the annoyance of a wet bed, or even prevent a severe scalding.

## FOUNTAIN SYRINGES.

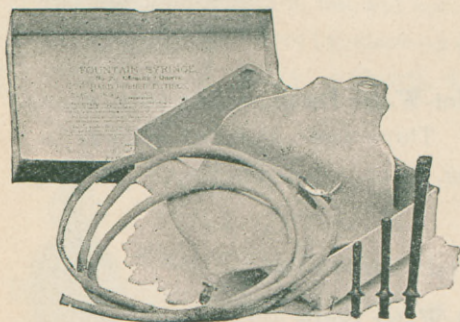
The fountain in most general use is the Fountain Syringe, a democratic implement used alike by rich and poor.

Fountain Syringes are to be had in every size, shape and quality; but, like hot-water bottles (and most other things), the better the grade, the cheaper the goods.

**The Riker Fountain Syringes** are warranted for a definite time. Other makes are sold without any guarantee whatever.

The Riker Fountain Syringes always last longer than the guaranteed period.

Small Fountain Syringes are seldom satisfactory. The larger sizes, 2 quarts and over, give the best results.

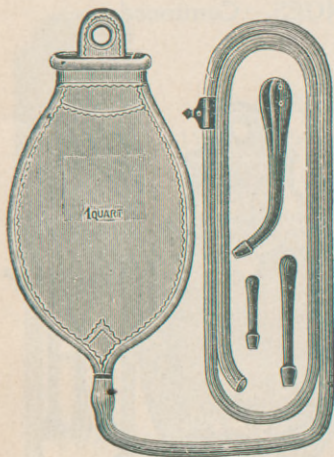


**The Wonder.**—A good quality syringe, light in weight, but strong. One size only, 2 quarts, 79c.

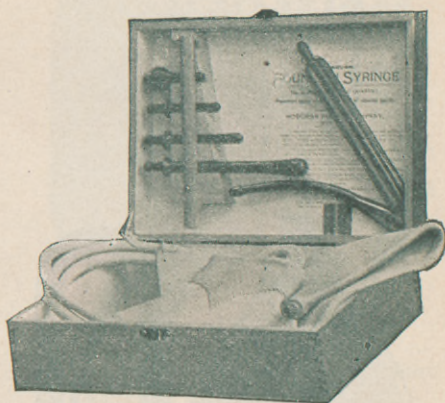
Don't use oil or turpentine in a Fountain Syringe or any other *soft* rubber syringe. Oil or turpentine will destroy the rubber in a few days. Glass, hard rubber or metal syringes should be used to administer oil.

## CAUTION.

When using a mixture in a fountain syringe, be careful to mix well in suitable vessel, after which pour into syringe.

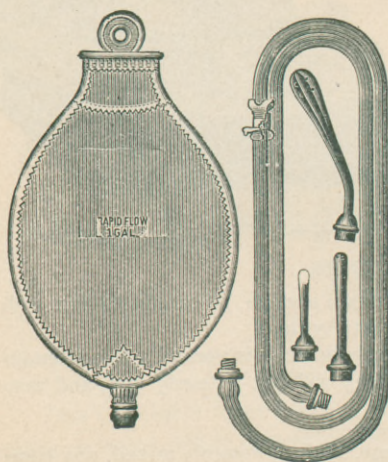
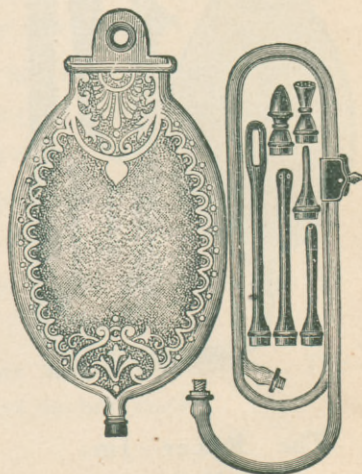
If a strong solution, such as carbolic acid, is poured into a fountain syringe and then filled with water, they will not properly mix, and may result in serious trouble.

Never pour into fountain syringe, until thoroughly mixed, any combination that can in any way be harmful.

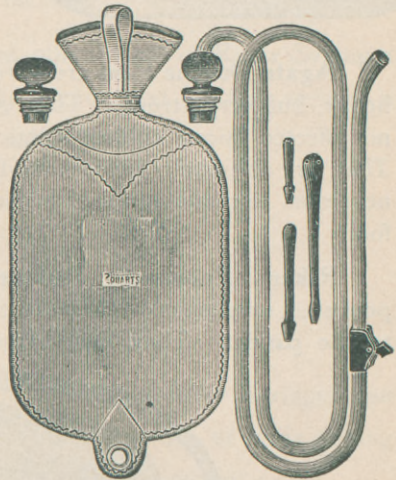

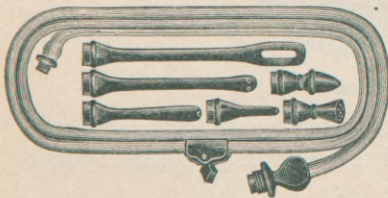

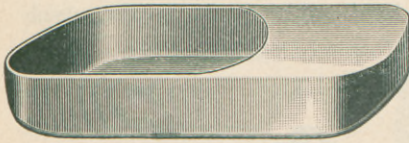

## ABOUT DOUCHE PANS.

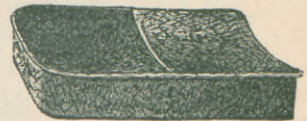
This is of interest to every user of a fountain syringe.

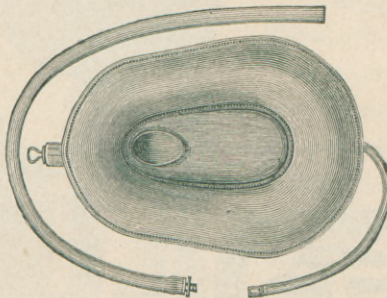


**Block Zinc Douche Pans** are light weight, but just as strong as tin and more durable, because they neither rust nor leak.

## BULB SYRINGES.

A little old-fashioned, to be sure, but still useful and much employed. For many purposes the Bulb Syringe cannot be replaced. Care should be exercised in selecting a Bulb Syringe. A defective valve or a leaky joint renders the syringe useless. Faulty construction is fatal to them.

The joints and valves and other parts of **Riker Syringes** are properly made and carefully put together. Every syringe is tested before being offered for sale.

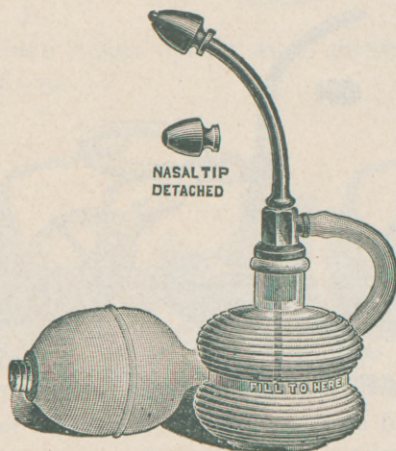
In using an atomizer, always hold the bottle upright. Never tilt the bottle or allow the contents to run into the rubber bulb.

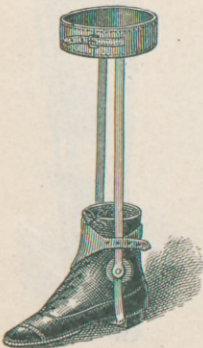
