Sir: (Through the Director)

On or about September 12, 1928, you will stand relieved from further duty at the Hygienic Laboratory, Washington, D. C. and are directed to proceed to Dublin, Ireland, for duty in the Office of the American Consul in connection with the examination of aliens prior to embarkation to the United States, and the carrying out of the provisions of the U. S. Quarantine Regulations applicable to ships and personnel destined to ports of the United States, reporting to Senior Surgeon Taliaferro Clark, in supervisory charge of Service operations in Europe, for instruction relative to your special assignment in Europe.

In carrying out the provisions of this order, you will be entitled to an allowance of eight cents per mile, within the limits of the United States of North America, and for that part of the travel which lies outside of the United States of North America, you will be entitled to your actual and necessary transportation expenses, together with \$6 per diem in lieu of subsistence.

You will also be allowed the actual transportation expenses of the dependent members of your family, as provided in law and regulations.

Government bills of lading for the shipment of your household effects are inclosed herewith.

You will please acknowledge receipt of this order, giving date of departure and arrival.

The travel directed is necessary in the public interest.
