We are enclosing a copy of a Resolution which was recently passed by our post. As we knew you were interested in the administration of all veterans' hospitals, we considered it our duty to acquaint you with our action in this matter.

We feel that the administration of this hospital has been particularly unfortunate in publicity of a rather scandalous nature which has quite recently appeared in the press and, even though in most cases there was some foundation for investigation, there was no reason for the attendant publicity. Being located in the same city in which this hospital is situated, we have been in immediate touch with these various situations as they arose. We, therefore, feel that we are better able to make an unbiased presentation of these facts.

This Post is particularly interested in the welfare and hospitalization of the patients in U. S. Veterans' Hospital No. 37, and it was with this idea in view that this Resolution was passed.
