

On the other hand, venereal diseases are relatively rarer in the States of Vermont, South Dakota, Utah, Wisconsin, New Hampshire, Washington, North Dakota, Oregon, Idaho, Maine, Massachusetts, Connecticut, and California, in which less than 1.5 per cent of the registrants were found to have any form of venereal disease. It will be noted that these are prevailing States of the northern tier—States with the lowest proportion of colored population; but some of these States contain a rather heavy proportion of recent immigrants, in part from southern Europe.
